Dear Becks Reformed Congregation:

The month of April has truly been an incredible time to grow spiritually in our Lord Jesus Christ. We had an excellent Congregational Meeting and Fellowship time in discussion of Project 2011. The Elders and several members took advantage of the quiet uninterrupted time at the April 26 Prayer Service to spend time with God. I'm sure I have left many wonderful things out that happened in the month of April, but what I do know is that God is blessing Becks Church, HIS Church, in so many ways. He has bought each of us to HIS church for a specific purpose - to grow and develop our relationship with Jesus Christ and use the God given gifts and talents to Disciple for Christ to the lost.

As the leadership of the church strives to lead the congregation to become a Great Church in the Eyes of God, we are continually reviewing our progress, first as individuals, and then as a church. We continue to spend much time in prayer, seeking the next God directed step. It has not always been easy and we have made some mistakes, but we, the entire congregation, in unity are going to continue to move God's church forward.

Some steps that have proven to be beneficial are the work of the Worship Coordinators. They have, in conjunction with Pastor Jerry, worked through some of the rough spots in our worship services. The leadership also has identified the need to better schedule and co-ordinate the activities and events of the church. Our church is very active. It is easy to plan an activity or schedule an event that may accidently compete/conflict with something already on the calendar. The Consistory has asked Kevin Firquin to become the Events Coordinator for Becks Reformed Church. This volunteer position is designed to assist in organizing the Church calendar to reduce these scheduling conflicts. We are asking the membership to please contact Kevin to book the fellowship hall or schedule a church activity. Forms for the fellowship hall are available at the church secretary's office and can be left at that office as well. Members may begin contacting Kevin so we can get a feel on what is needed to address the needs of the congregation. If you have suggestions, please see a Consistory member or speak with Kevin and thank you Kevin for this service.

Looking ahead, there is another volunteer opportunity for someone with a special gift in advertising and computer graphics. Our new digital sign, which is part of Project 2011, will have the capability to display detailed graphics for the promotion and announcing of church activities. If you feel that you may be interested or would like to learn more, please contact me or Blair Crouse. Currently, a detailed site plan is being developed that is required for the permitting process. We hope to have the new sign installed in about four to five months.

You may have already noticed that parts of Project 2011 are underway. The Consistory, in consultation with the Trustees, unanimously voted to hire AL Miller Construction to renovate the gym area into a new Praise Center. Construction has begun and the gym area is now locked and closed. The fellowship hall area (kitchen/dining) will remain open during this process, but we are asking for everyone to keep the gym area closed and especially keep small children away from this work area.

The new sound system has been quoted and will be ordered pending a pre-installation meeting, scheduled for May 3, with our Trustees,. We hope that it will be installed in the next ninety days.

In other business of the church, the Membership Role Committee has reviewed the church roles. A new directory that includes members and active non-members is now available and will be distributed in the mail boxes or you can pick one up at the church office.

We are also seeking help with the church library. There are many great resources in the library and if you are interested in keeping our library organized and maintained, please contact a Consistory member.

The trustees, in coordination Hebert Hedrick, are continuing their work on the new BBQ grill area. The concrete floor has been poured. New grills are being evaluated as well.

Again, on behalf of all the leadership, we appreciate all the efforts of those who volunteer for HIS church. We need your continued prayers, guidance and work to become the Great Church he wants us to be.

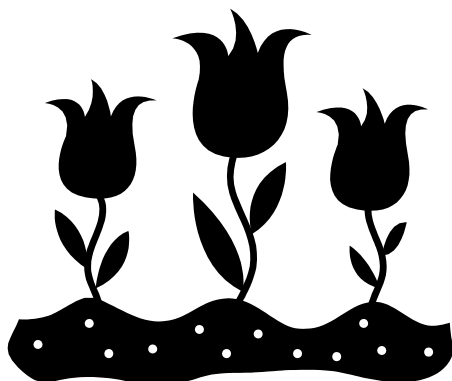
