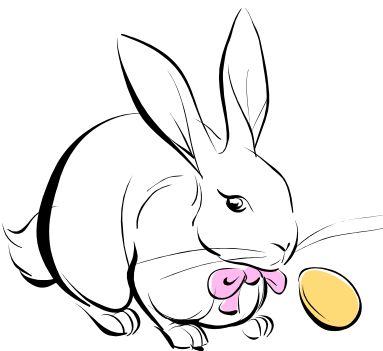

Prayer Concerns:

Pastor Jerry addressed the following prayer concerns: Jerry thanked everyone for their support and continued prayer during Kaye's unexpected death on

March 13, 2011. The funeral home visitation will be on March 16, 2011 at Davidson Funeral Home from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm. The service will be on March 17, 2011 at 11:00 am at Beck's Reformed Church. The burial will be in Cleveland, Tennessee on Saturday, March 19, 2011 at 2:00 pm. There should be people from Missouri, Ohio and Virginia. Kaye had a great love and compassion for Beck's Reformed Church. 16 kids from KFC, CYF, MSY and CWG's visited Carolina House completed crafts with the residents had snacks and sang with Katie and Joseph Young.

ASH Wednesday service was great for the SPLASH kids that all participated in having their heads marked with ashes.

Mission Trip: The \$2000.00 that was left to be raised has been donated and the cost is now covered.

Camp Caswell Trip is scheduled for July and a deposit has been made.

Kristie Regan also reported on Get Revived and update on Non-Profit Status. Kristie has spoken to Craig Idol, Accountant and Shirley Putnum, Book keeper concerning Non-Profit Status. At this point Kristie was directed to IRS.gov to complete on-line forms for Non Profit Cooperation-501 3C and the cost has been \$60.00 thus far. Kristie is to meet with Ted Myers, Accountant on Friday for further direction. .

Kristie continued that the internet is still needed in the Fellowship Hall due to the increasing size of the Middle and High School numbers on Wednesday night at SPLASH. A handout of proposed solutions for handicap accessibility were handed out. Option 1: provide hard plastic runners over outlets and ensure 48 inch wide area open at all times. Option 2: addition of side stage and moving pulpit to the center of the front of the church.

Blair Couse made the motion to accept Option 1 to proceed with plan to accommodate the Fire Marshall's Report. Have Option 2 be reviewed by the Trustees to look at feasibility of the additional stage, the cost and the addition of 2 double doors. The addition of the stage will enhance the electrical jacks and electrical outlets with the proposed new sound system.

The Finance Committee has spent much time in prayer and believes that God has led them to present the following Financial Plan. The Consistory carefully studied the Financial Plan in a special called Consistory meeting on April 4, 2011 and subsequently **unanimously** endorsed and approved the Motion set forth in the Financial Plan as called for by the Project 2011 Finance Committee. The Consistory is recommending to the Congregation to also approve the Motion set forth in Financial Plan for Project 2011. The details of the Motion and Financial Plan are below.

After discussion the Consistory recommends that the sound system, sign, and Praise Center construction begin upon Congregation approval of this Financial Plan. The Consistory in consultation with the Trustees will manage the Projects. In addition the Consistory along with the Finance Committee will monitor the fund raising and decide when best to purchase the bus.

The Consistory has called a Congregational Meeting on April 16th, 2011 at 5:00PM at the Beck's Reformed Church Fellowship Hall at which time the Finance Committee will present to the Congregation their Financial Plan and Vote afterwards. Dinner will be provided and served to everyone at no charge. The Congregational meeting will be Called to Order after the meal and fellowship. Child care will be available after the dinner. Members are encouraged to study the enclosed proposal and the Motion herein. This will be an informative and voting meeting in which Members will have adequate time to ask questions about the Financial Plan.

The Consistory very much appreciates all the time and effort that the Finance Committee has put in to develop the Project 2011 Financial Plan. The names of the members are below and you are invited to contact them prior to the Congregational meeting if you so desire. This is an important time in the life of God's Church, and we hope that you will make plans to be at the meeting.

There are two examples our Master gave us through parables within the Gospels of Matthew and Luke that outline what we should do with our talents that He has given us. The parable of the Talents should pierce all of our hearts when we read it. (Matthew 25:14-30; Luke 19:12-28)

It is a simple story that our Lord tells here.

A man who is preparing to leave on a journey entrusts his possessions to his servants. He distributes his wealth among three servants, apportioned to them on the basis of their abilities. To the first he entrusted five talents, to the second two talents, and to the third one talent. The first two servants quickly set to work with their master's money. The third servant did not invest his master's money at all; he dug a hole in the ground and buried his master's money. When the master returned, the first two eagerly met their master, apparently delighted in the opportunity to multiply their master's money. Both were commended as "good and faithful servants"; both were rewarded with increased responsibilities in their master's service; both were invited to share in their master's joy.

The master's dealings with the third servant is a very different matter. This servant came to his master with only the talent his master had originally entrusted to him. He did not increase his master's money at all. In fact, if this were to take place today that money would likely be worth less, due to inflation. This servant offered a feeble excuse for his conduct. He told his master that he was a harsh and cruel man, a man who was demanding, and who expected gain where he had not labored. He contended that this is why he was afraid to take a risk with any kind of investment. (Sound familiar?) And so he simply hid the money, and now he returned it, without any gain. The master rebuked this slave for being evil and lazy. He took his talent from him, gave it to the one who earned ten, and cast this fellow into outer darkness, where there was weeping and gnashing of teeth.

We should carefully note the outcome of faithful service, and of unfaithful service, in this parable. Faithful service led to increased responsibilities in the kingdom of heaven, and eternal joy in the presence of the Master, Jesus Christ. Unfaithful service led to condemnation, the removal of one's stewardship, and an eternity of weeping and gnashing of teeth in outer darkness, away from the presence of our Lord.

One must surely conclude that this parable is not just an interesting story, but a message of eternal significance. Let us listen carefully then, looking to God's Spirit to enlighten our hearts and minds, and to empower our service, to the glory of God and our eternal good.

⁴⁴ “The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field. When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy went and sold all he had and bought that field.

Point being - he gave everything he had to get the field. He knew there was a treasure there and he gave what he had to get it. He was willing to give everything to see it happen. If we see a treasure (the possibility of bringing the gift of salvation to one person) through these projects, we need to take a leap of faith and make it happen.

¹⁶ And he told them this parable: “The ground of a certain rich man yielded an abundant harvest. ¹⁷ He thought to himself, ‘What shall I do? I have no place to store my crops.’

¹⁸ “Then he said, ‘This is what I’ll do. I will tear down my barns and build bigger ones, and there I will store my surplus grain. ¹⁹ And I’ll say to myself, ‘You have plenty of grain laid up for many years. Take life easy; eat, drink and be merry.’”

²⁰ “But God said to him, ‘You fool! This very night your life will be demanded from you. Then who will get what you have prepared for yourself?’

²¹ “This is how it will be with whoever stores up things for themselves but is not rich toward God.”

Point being – we can save money forever and think of every circumstance that may come up for us to need that money but we never know what tomorrow holds. We can store away that money where it won’t save one person or make any difference in God’s Kingdom, or we can put it to use in projects today where we might have a chance of using it to save a soul and to change lives.
