### From the Pastor...Are You Praying For Your Church?

When one begins the process of going through a deceased loved one's things, it is often a difficult thing to do but God has a way of bring special joys even in this situation. So it was when I went through my beloved Kaye's things. I was touched again and again by her love of Jesus when I read the many notes she had stuck here and there. Among the notes were old "to do" lists, some of them she had gotten done and some not and there were grocery lists but there were also treasures. The treasures were those notes that were windows into her soul: I want to share one of her last notes with you.

"Spend 30 min. 2X a week to pray for our church. Monday thank God for those who attended church and then pray for those who did not

attend. 2X on Saturday pray for the Holy Spirit to touch their lives to attend tomorrow." And then she wrote, 'Dear Lord, You have a vision for each of us and a vision for this, Your church. Open our hearts so we may see and know your vision. Help us to put You first and do all you told us to do. Help us to be obedient and not concentrate on others mistakes so that with forgiving and loving hearts we may work for You and Your Kingdom to give life to Your vision for each of us and for Your church. Pray for God to prepare each of us and our church to receive those persons God sends to join with us in His work. Receive them not as strangers but as those He has chosen to be our brothers and sisters in Christ's mission.

The text above is from Acts and is the preface text for the great revival God the Holy Spirit brought upon the Church at Pentecost. Note that the revival was, as all great revivals are, prefaced with devout prayer. My late beloved wife was above all things a woman of prayer but I seldom heard her praying for herself, except that she might be more pure in her love for Jesus, but her supplications were for others and for true revival at Beck's Reformed Church. If all of us would take up such a prayer life then I believe we will be amazed at three things which will occur: 1) We personally will be changed, 2) other's lives will be changed and 3) our church will be changed! hurry but grand things happened. Thank you to the beachcombers youth group for organizing Homecoming Sunday with Martin Burkhart as our guest speaker. It was truly an extraordinary event.

Over forty teenagers and adult volunteers went to the mountains of Tennessee on the annual week long mission trip. Our young people witnessed to those in that mountain community by repairing a roof, building two decks and a set of stairs, painted the inside of the mobile home and the barn all for an elderly visually impaired lady. Then we shared in powerful Holy Spirit-Filled worship services every evening with young people from Michigan, Georgia, Pennsylvania, Florida & Tennessee. Several of our young people gave their life to the Lord and many more re-dedicated their lives to serve God and live a holy life. It was an amazing trip. HUGE thank you to Kristie Regan for her incredible work with the young people of our church and community. We are so blessed to have her serve as our Youth Director.

The Middle and High School youth groups are travelling to Fort Caswell Christian Retreat Center on Oak Island, NC this July. Please pray for their safe travel.

We are still moving forward as Servant Leaders and as His Congregation in unity, striving to become a Great Church in the Eyes of God. We are continually reviewing our progress, first as individuals, in our Sunday School Classes and Small groups. We need your voice, your prayers, your God directed ideas and your continued help and support that will help us move upward to the next God directed steps.

If this sounds like a repeat from last

month's letter, it is! What we are doing together at Beck's is not something that is done in a month or two. This process that we are all engaged in is a commitment to be the best ("Great") for our Lord. He wants nothing less from us.

Project 2011 is moving right along. The new Sound System has been ordered at a cost of \$57,300.00 which includes the wiring and installation. The installation is expected to be completed by the end of July.

The Gym renovation is progressing ahead of schedule. AL Miller construction has been doing an outstanding job on this project. The Consistory has been reviewing the furnishings for the new Praise / Meeting Center and will making the final decisions at the next Consistory meeting in July. We expect if everything falls into place, it will be open by the first/ middle of September. Last month, I wrote to you that we have not officially named the new renovated gym area. Some of us have been calling it the "Praise Center", others the "GYM". There is still time to make your suggestions for the name of the new Renovated Gym. Please let me know by Monday morning- July 11th as the Consistory will be deciding on the name of our new Praise / Meeting center at the July meeting.

The Digital Sign has been quoted and the site plan has been completed. We are still awaiting permits and expect the sign to be installed sometime in September/October.

The Consistory is planning to move forward with the purchase of the Church Bus sometime this late fall or winter.

The Consistory is paying careful attention to the dollars for each project.

### From the Consistory...continued

Our goal is to come in at budget or less on each part of Project 2011. We will have a detailed budget available on Project 2011 next month as we will have a better idea of the numbers.

In other church business:

- The Technology Committee is doing an inventory on all Church computers, TV's, sound & video systems, band equipment, copiers and other equipment for insurance purposes.
- New guidelines have written for the Fellowship Hall, the new Praise/Meeting Center and other church facilities. They are to be finalized at the July Consistory meeting and will be published for everyone.
- The Deacons presented a new

plan to the Consistory on how better to manage the Church finances. A Purchase Order system is now in place. This will help the church recoup state sales tax dollars that we pay on various items. The Consistory unanimously approved the plan.

 We are planning a Celebration/ Dedication day on a Saturday in September where we will formally invite our church family and community to come together and dedicate the new Praise/Meeting Center. The date will be finalized at the July consistory meeting.

Finally, I want to say it is honor to serve you, my fellow believers and especially our Lord and Savior in HIS church. I have had the privilege and honor to teach the "Young" Men's Sunday School class this past month. As I looked across the room of some

of the blessed Godly men of our church, God reminded me how blessed we are as a church to have had these saints and their spouses who worked so hard because of their love of Christ to provide the facilities we enjoy today. THANK YOU! We also spent some time on the 4th of July Sunday discussing some of the problems our nation faced. Our conclusion was that if we..."if my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin, and will heal their land."(2 Chronicles7:14). We hope that the entire Congregation will join

We all enjoyed fellowship while eating at the end of the business session. We were glad to have Pastor Jerry and Kristie Regan join us for our meal.


