Consistory Report

To My Dearest Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I pray with the upmost of sincerity, that you are experiencing day by day, the incredible blessings, peace, joy and grace promised by our Savior Jesus Christ. I can see so many drawing closer and closer to Him in their walk, and many lives being changed because of a renewed, close, personal and loving relationship with Him. It is all He promised and more.

Our Church is truly blessed that the Lord has sent so many folks to our Congregation that love the Lord and love to serve for HIM. I'm thankful to be a small part of an active Congregation that is positively impacting His church, His community and His world for Christ. The ministries and services provided to so many are a direct result of those in the Congregation who chose to get off the side lines and get involved. Thank you for utilizing your God given gifts for the glory of our Lord and for His purpose.

We finished the month of April with an incredible Holy Spirit filled youth conference at Camp Walter Johnson-GET REVIVED. There were approximately 500 people in attendance from all over the area. We know that five young people gave their life to the Lord and many more re-dedicated their lives to serve God and live a holy life.

Looking forward to this summer, we have 43 middle/high students, plus seven adult volunteers going to the mountains of Tennessee on the annual mission trip. 35 young people signed up to go to Camp Caswell in July. Thank you Becks Church for your commitment to invest the time and financial resources so that the young people of our church and community will experience the joy and peace of having a faith relationship in our Lord Jesus Christ.

We are still moving forward as Servant Leaders and as His Congregation in unity, striving to become a Great Church in the Eyes of God. We are continually reviewing our progress, first as individuals, in our Sunday School Classes and Small groups. We need your voice, your prayers, your God directed ideas and your continued help and support that will help us move upward to the next God directed steps.

Project 2011 is moving right along. The new Sound System has been ordered (HOORAY!) at a cost of \$57,300.00 which includes the wiring and installation. The trustees, our sound & video technician volunteers, our music director and the company that we are purchasing the new system from had an extensive pre-installation meeting. We hope that the system will be completed by the end of July.

The Gym renovation is progressing along on schedule. The fellowship hall area will remain open during this process, but the gym area is closed. We are asking for everyone to stay clear of the work area for safety reasons. We have not officially named the new renovated gym area. Some of us have been calling it the "Praise Center", others the "GYM". We are seeking your suggestions for the name of the new Renovated Gym. This new Praise /Meeting center can be used by everyone in the church. Some events that it can be used for but not limited too are Saturday night coffee/singing group events, Women's and/or Men's Gatherings, Sunday School Class events, small group bible studies, Senior Citizens events and various fundraisers. This new Praise/Meeting center will be used for youth events as well.

Some activities that are already being planned are Friday Night 5th Quarter Youth Night, Youth meetings, Youth Rally's and Plays, Bible school activities, Movie nights, Training Center and Wednesday night Splash. These are but a few of the potential uses and you may have other ideas as well. Please share your ideas with us. We hope that you will consider these functions when suggesting a name for the new center. Please feel free to email any Consistory member or call the church office with your suggestion.

This will free up the Conference room to be used again for meetings & Sunday School classes.

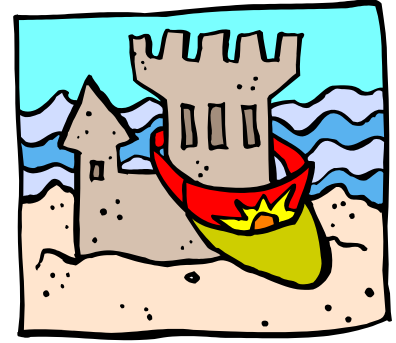

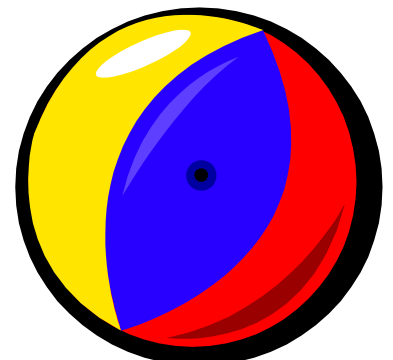

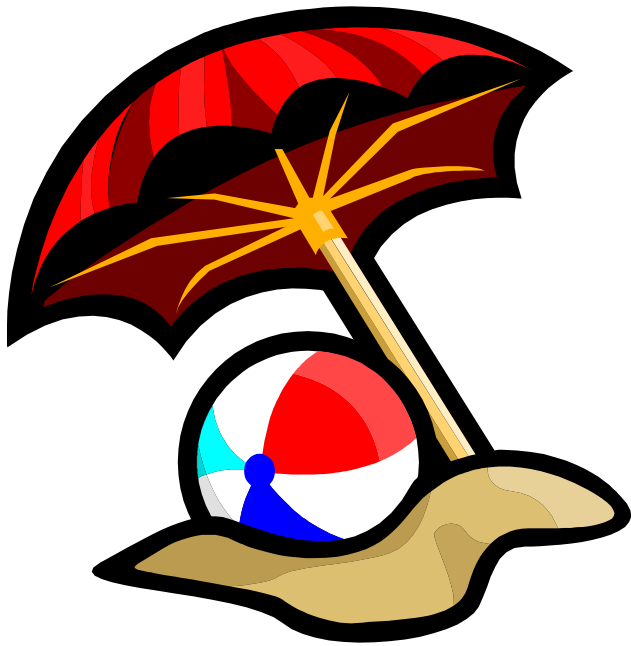
Since Jerry was not about to attend, Marilyn spoke about the trips. The Beach Trip papers are ready and some were passed out during the

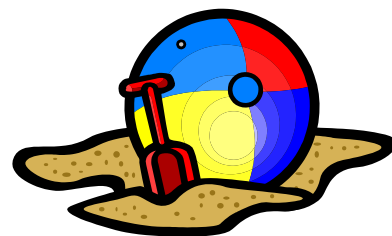

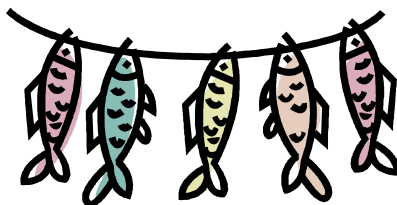

Calling all Women, young and old...

Scripture: Blessed are those who have regard for the weak. The Lord delivers them in times of trouble. The Lord protects and preserves them. They are counted among the blessed in the land” Psalm 41:1-2

Mission: To help assist young women to achieve independence and to know Christ. Although we all have our personal struggles, we are sincerely blessed in our country. Women of other nations often have no voice and no power. They are subject to the culture mores of their community, which cares very little about them.

Why do I care? In 2008, I was completing the last class to receive my MHA. I was four weeks from turning in a twenty-five page policy paper on Global HIV that I had researched for three months. My focus was on Vietnam and the progress this country had made toward lifting the stigma of HIV and Aids and what inspired an oppressive country to change. One day I was thumbing through a magazine sitting in our home office. I took note of a picture of a young child in a third world country who was orphaned. His mother had died of AIDS. That picture haunted me. I had looked for a topic for this policy paper for months and now, 4 weeks from the due date, I would happen to find a story in this child's face.

I really wanted this impulse to vanish. My paper was written. It was due in 4 weeks. I will not start this over, I thought. I will not pass if I do... but you know what happens after BUT... The spirit inside of me told me to write this story. I just couldn't get this child out of my mind. I presumed at this point the Lord really did not care about my timelines. I took my 25 page rough draft and started over, four weeks prior to the date it was due. I had to somehow filter through all kinds of data and information to figure out what I was even looking for. Two-thirds of my rough draft was useless as the research no longer applied. But, the Lord is good. I finished the paper the morning it was due and had a few hours to spare to email it to my professor, who muttered a few words about me waiting to the last minute.

I will give you the abridged version of what I learned and I believe what God showed me. The U.S. and other countries have spent Billions trying to eradicate this disease, but we still have pictures of orphaned children in magazines. In addition to this, HIV was increasing worldwide in females disproportionately to males, but wasn't this mostly a male disease? This disease is tenaciousness, but its very existence shines a critical flood light into matters we would rather not see, one of which is the impact of poverty and economic disparity of women. Even the billions of dollars in "prevention" basically throws a pale of water on a brush fire and even the pails are regulated to be used a certain way. Prevention was destined to be in the format of the A, B, C's... which stand for Abstinence, Being Faithful and Condoms, none of which are under the control of disempowered women. All of these are great Christian values but they don't work in a world where Christianity is not practiced. Many women across the globe have no power and no way to support themselves. They marry older men, who generally are not faithful. They contract HIV through no fault of their own. These women will avoid treatment centers because to do so would most likely end in excommunication from the family and villages which is their only form of support. Many nations "throw money at the problem but offer few real solutions" because they really don't want to deal with this much bigger and uglier infestation. No one addresses social class, poverty, lack of education, opportunity and the ongoing struggles of women who have no power and no voice in their economic future.

Dr. Thomas is different. At quiet corners India, he shares the story of Christ and helps young women build a vocation through learning to sew, so each can go back to their village and support themselves. Once they have completed his year with him, they are given a sewing machine if he has money to do so. For 100.00 dollars, the cost of one sewing machine, Dr. Thomas can change a young women's life. I don't know if the women he sees are threatened with the disease of Aids, but I do know that poverty and lack of empowerment lead to prostitution and hopelessness.

I hope you will consider changing a young girls' life, which ultimately changes her children's life, by helping the Missions Committee fund this effort and in return, take home your very own fresh water pearls! We all have been blessed to have been born in America. Please join us in our "Mission: Pearls to Sewing Machines" on June 26th in the Fellowship Hall from 2 to 5pm. There will be light refreshments. Pearls are a great gift for Christmas, Birthdays and those special women in your life. Honor her today by helping Dr. Samuels change and save lives. All proceeds from this event will go directly to Dr. Thomas to support his Women's Vocational Training Program, where I am sure the women learn of Christ through his humbleness and generosity. Can people see Christ in your face?
