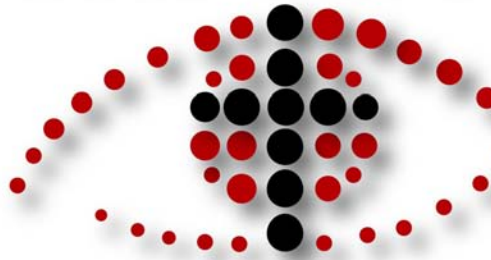

After talking with him, I knew I had his blessings and his promised prayers to get something special going on for these SPECIAL people...God's people.

This is a ministry that provides special visits every month to our homebound members and nursing home members. We are so appreciated by the ones we visit, and we get such great feedback from their family members at how much their loved ones enjoy this. We've actually got several shut-ins that are SOMETIMES able to go out to eat with the volunteers and OH HOW THEY LOVE THIS!!! I feel in my heart that this is a much needed ministry and I give God all the glory for placing it on my heart. I also praise God for giving all the volunteers a serving heart for others, and for saying YES to Him. We live in such a fast-paced world and society. This ministry provides a bridge for us as volunteers to walk across to join in making a person of God less lonely and to feel more loved. BELIEVE me, our visit, our handshake, our hug, our caring personality, our meal, our prayer, our listening ears can all make a TREMENDOUS difference in their day....their life! 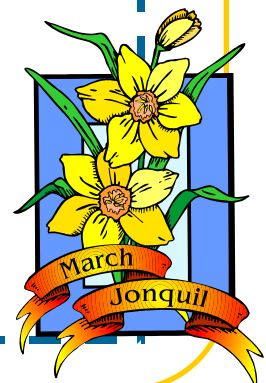

Consistory Minutes...February 14, 2011

Call to order

John Bryant called to order the regular meeting of the Beck's Reformed Church Inc. Consistory Meeting on February 14, 2011 at 7:00 pm at Beck's Reformed Church.

Attendance

The following people were present: John Bryant, Rick Black, Greg Burkhart, Tim Burkhart, Blair Crouse, Joyce Greer, Herbert Hedrick, Rick Leonard, Steve Regan, Pastor Jerry Sanders, Jed Stewart, Tara Young, Jerry Hedrick and Kristie Regan.

Devotions

Tim Burkhart provided devotions for the meeting.

Prayer Concerns:

Pastor Jerry addressed the following prayer concerns: Karen Allred had a fall, Margaret Burkhart has stress fracture of her foot, Bobby Crotts had been moved to ICU to do an allergic reaction to his medication, but should be moving back into a regular room at Forsyth for a few days, Baby Rose Burnsides and Roger Younts and family. Rick Leonard lead the prayer over these concerns.

Approval of Minutes

Minutes from the January 10, 2011 Consistory Meeting were reviewed. The minutes were approved as presented with a motion to accept by Tim Burkhart and a 2nd by Herbert Hedrick. Motion passed unanimously.

Approval of Financial Reports

Financial Reports for January 2011 were presented. The financial reports for January 2011 were approved as presented with a motion to accept by Tim Burkhart and a 2nd by Greg Burkhart.

Discussion of financial reports were as follows: Reports should start to be emailed for next months meeting. Blair passed out a worksheet that he had completed that showed \$39,218.00 had been paid out for January and that was \$9,900.00 that had been brought in by tithing. Blair expressed a concern on how to relay what information is shared with the congregation to get a realistic overview of the accounts that the church has. Everyone needs to pray and think about this and come back with ideas on how to report and whether to use the bulletin and/or newsletter.

Motion passed unanimously.

Youth Pastor's Report

Kristie Regan reviewed the following information concerning the youth:

All Church Skating Party was in January with a good turn-out and that the Middle School met afterwards at John Bryant's house and the CWG's met at Don Juan's.

MSY cooked for Crisis Ministry and then went to play with the kids at Genesis House. The youth have asked to go back and play with the kids again.

Mission Trip has 35 slots booked and total cost will be \$12,000.00. this includes van rental and gas also. There is about \$2000.00 left to be raised and an option is to do BBQ Chicken again.

Kristie Regan also reported on Get Revived and would like to turn it into a Non-Profit Status to be eligible for grants and other corporations to be able to donate. This would entail CPA, lawyer and to have their own insurance. It was recommended for Kristie to speak to Shirley Putnam, as she was involved in the church and its status.

Blair Crouse made the motion for Kristie to pursue a separate Non-Profit Organization Status for Get Revived.

2nd by Greg Burkhart

No discussion.

Motion passed unanimously.

Kristie continued that the internet is needed in the Fellowship Hall due to the increasing size of the Middle and High School numbers on Wednesday night at SPLASH. Rick Black, Kent McCarn, Blair Crouse and Eddie Swing are working on this. During the prayer time, all the kids at SPLASH offered a prayer for Roger Younts and family. There is a need for teachers for SPLASH and one of the younger youth groups and that we need to be in prayer over this. Jed Stewart offered to teach or help if needed. John Bryant commented that we are very pleased with the work that Kristie is doing, the extra hours she works and counseling the kids with everyday issues.

Pastor's Report

Pastor Jerry continues to be very busy visiting the many members who are in the hospitals and as many of the shut-ins he can. He is working with the Elders, and supportive counseling in addition to preparing for his sermons. Stan Hankins has asked him to teach in the islands this summer and Jerry is considering this and will inform the consistory of his decision.

Pastor Jerry also shared with the Consistory the needs of those who are ill in our church (in some cases, financial needs). He has spoken with the Deacons about those needs that this is an opportunity for the office of Deacon to expand more from of an administrative position into more of a service position. Pastor Jerry also suggests that the Deacons start a monthly meeting as the Elders have done. Tara Young requested guidance and direction from Pastor Jerry at the Deacons meetings which he is willing to do.

Committee Assignments/Reports

Cemetery-Tim Burkhart

No meeting has taken place. It was requested by John Bryant that the committee update the cemetery map that is located in the hall, to include correct church name.

Trustees-Herbert Hedrick

The trustees meet last Tuesday and Herbert was present.

The trustees chose not to endorse a proposal from Joseph Young for various landscaping projects. The trustees have asked Joseph to prepare a plan with scheduled landscaping issues.

New mowing contract was unanimously approved by the trustees and that they will be more proactive in overseeing the services. The contract includes bagging the grass in the cemetery, spraying bank at Fellowship Hall, and putting out pine needles (church to buy pine needles).

Blair Crouse made the motion to accept the \$7500.00 mowing contract with Jackson Mowing Lawn Care for 2011 at \$625.00 per month. The purchase of pine needles will be taken from the Mowing Line Item. Jackson Mowing Lawn Care is required to have Liability Insurance and a certificate in naming Beck's Reformed Church as insured.

2nd by Greg Burkhart

No discussion.

Motion passed unanimously.

Trustees have revisited the project of repairing the wall in front of

the parsonage. It has been looked at again by Arnold Lee Miller and agreed unanimously to remove the wall and fill in with dirt, leaving the steps and ample parking.

Steve Regan made the motion to accept the proposal in demolition of the

Steve Regan made the motion to accept the proposal in demolition of the wall in front of the parsonage and replanting of the bank as proposed by Arnold Lee Miller that was approved by the trustees not to exceed \$3000.00.

2nd by Rick Black

No discussion.

Motion passed unanimously.

Tara Young made the motion for the \$3000.00 for the demolition of the wall in front of the parsonage to be shown on the Repairs/Maintenance Line Item of the Budget.

2nd Herbert Hedrick

No discussion.

Motion passed unanimously.

John Bryant asked for the Trustees to look at the tiles in the

kitchen in the Fellowship Hall.

Tara Young asked if the roof had been fixed in the FFC class and

Herbert stated that it had been fixed according to the trustees.

Update on Bookkeeping Financial Records

John Bryant spoke with Shirley Putnam and offered to get a CPA to load computer program and provide training for Shirley and Joyce Greer if needed. Shirley is currently working to get all church financial records loaded into the computer.

Inclement Weather Update

Blair Crouse reported the plan that him and Tara Young had prepared. In the event of inclement weather, Fox 8, Channel 12 and Channel 2 will be contacted. They have all been updated with correct name of church, Beck's Reformed Church. Pastor Jerry and John Bryant and Leslie Ward have the codes to contact the stations to put that the services have been cancelled. Also, in the event of inclement weather, there will sent to everyone who has an email address listed with the church. Also, the all current Elders and Deacons will start a calling tree to all Sunday School teachers and Key Service Members. John Bryant and Pastor Jerry will contact all church staff. New Business

Review of Existing and New Proposed Committees

New Committee- Membership Role Committee:

Purpose: To oversee all membership records for the Consistory in compliance with Beck's Reformed Church Constitution. It shall be the obligation of the Consistory to review the membership rolls each year and ascertain the standings of all its members as called for in the Beck's Reformed Church Constitution.

Description of Responsibility:

Provide to the membership an accurate Church Directory annually

Assist the Pastor and Church Secretary on overseeing of membership records

See that all membership changes are brought to Consistory and Elder Board

Evaluate record keeping procedures and make changes as needed with approval by Pastor or President

Audit membership list quarterly

Confirm all new members are added by letter of transfer or other ways

Confirm all youth that go through confirmation are added

Audit all letters of transfer or removal to denote names are removed correctly

Review all deceased members are removed on a timely basis

Manage the process and audit the results when the consistory decides to mail letters to the membership asking if they want to maintain membership status

Discussion for members to include Chair: Blair Crouse, Jennifer Firquin, Carol Crouse, Maxine King and John King, Rick Black, John Bryant, and Pastor Jerry Sanders.

Motion passed unanimously.

New Committee- Technology Committee:

Purpose: To provide technical support, including maintenance & repair of the electronic equipment of the Church.

The Committee will also maintain accurate records, including a list- serial numbers of specific machines and a file of all the contracts, leases and warranties on all electronic equipment.

Committee will review with staff and other users within the Church their specific technology needs.

Committee will oversee the maintenance & repair of electronic equipment.

When new electronic equipment is required, the Committee will recommend to the Consistory what type of equipment to purchase.

The Committee will oversee the Equipment to include new Digital Sign, Sound System, Video, TV's, DVD & VCR recorder players, Telephones, fax machines, Computers and Printers, and Security cameras.

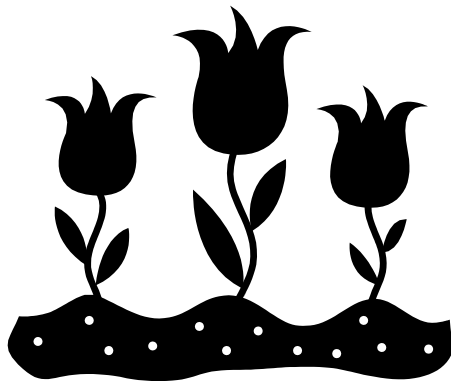

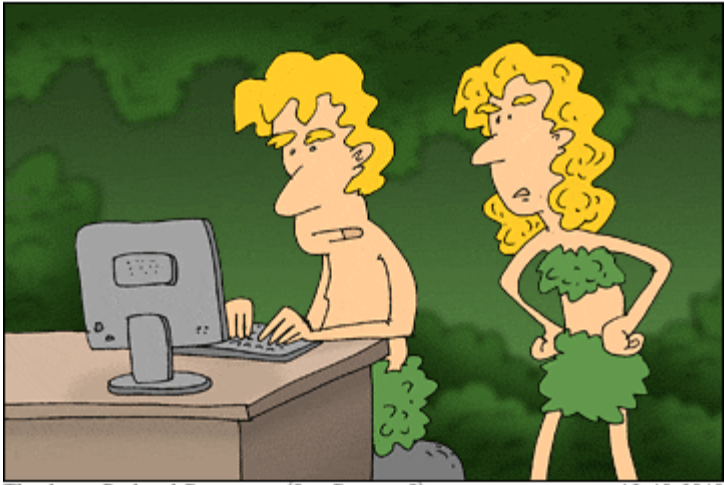
