Congregational Question and Answer Session Regarding the Proposed Constitutional Changes

All Members Are Welcome and Encouraged to Attend

October has been a great month in the life of Becks Church. Thank you to all the Senior Citizens who worked so hard to have the poor mans supper. Sure was some great fiddles. Thank you to the organizers of the Ladies Spiritual Renewal which bought participants from all over the area. Thank you to the missions committee who hosted Graham Carter during his time with us at revival. Our Youth Director, Kristie Regan organized a special Wednesday night version of the "Crash Program" with the musical group The WhoSoEvers. Over 125 teenagers from surrounding churches and the American Children's home on Highway 8 came to the Praise Center to enjoy the music and hear a truly powerful testimony. Thank you Kristie for your amazing commitment to the Spiritual Welfare of our young people. Thank you to the volunteers who helped get the new digital sign installed and all the bugs worked out. So many of you are continuing to step up and use your gifts- thank you! If you are not involved and want to volunteer in HIS church, please call the church office or let a Consistory member know. There is a place for you. God is so awesome!

Your Consistory has been working hard as well. There will be four very important items to vote on at the Congregation meeting on December 4th.

- Item one- new Deacons and Elders.
- Item two- the budget for the next fiscal year.
- **Item three** to approve or disapprove changing the Constitution to move the fiscal year of the church to begin March 1st and end the last day of February and move the annual Congregational Meeting to the month of February.

Item four- to approve or disapprove a Procedural Process for Ordination and Licensing for Ministry

The Consistory unanimously approved all four items. We realize that Items Three and Four are new to you and understand that you will have a lot of questions. In the subsequent pages of this Newsletter, there are two different letters each describing and explaining in detail Items three and four. Since we are proposing to change the church constitution and introduce a self ordination process, we have planned an informational question and answer session about all four items, **Sunday at 1:30PM- November 13th**. This will not be a congregational meeting day, rather an informal time for you to gather information and ask questions.

Your Consistory has spent much time in prayer and believes that these new measures will serve the church well. We are asking you to continue to pray for each other, HIS church, our nation, and all those in leadership positions...from our world leaders to our church leadership. Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing. I Thessalonians 5:11.

We also hope that if you have not attended recently, that you would consider re-dedicating Sunday morning for worship. Jesus made it a priority to meet together with other believers. As followers of Christ, shouldn't we? He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. Luke 4:16. It was His custom- His regular practice- to go to church. The Joy of our faith is a genuine relationship with God and an opportunity to experience all of the blessings he has planned for us as we relate within HIS church body.

Dear Beloved Members of Beck's Reformed Church:

Attached with this letter is a proposed procedure for the licensing and ordaining of ministers in Beck's Reformed Church. This proposal was unanimously endorsed by your Consistory and is going to be presented to you, the members of our church, for action at our forthcoming annual meeting. I want to take the time to share with you why the Consistory wants your approval and support for this approach to ordaining and licensing ministers in our church.

This important undertaking has come about firstly because the Holy Spirit is truly working in our church. When God begins to touch a congregation with the Holy Spirit and begins to bring it into a spiritual awakening, one of the things that happen is that people begin to experience the call to full time ministry. We have seen this in the calling of Kristie Regan into the full time youth ministry of our church and all of us know the outstanding job she is doing. God has also spoken to the hearts of Kevin Firquin and Steve Regan with a call to ministerial leadership and ministry. These people are children of our church and we rejoice that the Holy Spirit is calling them to a special setting a part of their lives for specialized ministry. We, as their mother congregation, have a special responsibility for them. We are to encourage and help them on their way to higher realms of service.

Since Beck's Reformed Church has decided to remain an Independent Reformed Church, there is no place these called servants of God can turn to other than our own congregation to recognize and authorize them for ministry in the capacities to which they have been called. The practice of the local church ordaining and licensing persons who have been called into ministry is well founded and is the norm in all independent churches. Your Consistory honors the choice that our congregation has made to remain independent so we come to you with this proposal to establish a method for recognizing and authorizing people called to ministry within our church. In doing this, we shall say to the other churches that these persons are able to perform in the Lord's wider field as ministers of the Gospel. It would serve to allow them to receive wider recognition as ministers of the Gospel and open doors for new opportunities for ministry. It would be sad if these people whom God has called to Christian service had to go to some other group or church to get ordained or licensed.

You can see by the proposed document that any person licensed or ordained by this church will have met the highest standards and will be persons of whom we shall not be ashamed. We will be extending the work of the Lord by making available to the wider church, as well as our own, ordained and licensed ministers of the Gospel. We, your Consistory, hope you will support us in establishing this proposal for training and authorizing members of our church who are being called into the Lord's wider service to His church.

Proposed Procedural Process for Ordination and Licensing for Ministry – Becks Reformed Church

- 1. Candidate shall be recommended to the Consistory by written notice the Senior Pastor. The Senior Pastor shall state to the Consistory why he believes this candidate(s) are qualified and prepared for the office for which they seek licensing or ordination.
- 2. The Candidates shall be interviewed by the Consistory and inquiry shall be made as to:
 - a. A testimony of their call to the office for which they are seeking authorization.
 - b. The candidate shall describe why they wish to be authorized for this office.
 - c. A description of the candidate's perception of the duties of the office for which they seek authorization.
 - d. Discussion of how they perceive this authorization will affect their future in terms of their Christian service and ministry?
 - e. Does the candidate's family support their call to ministry?
 - f. How does the candidate see or understand their ongoing relationship top Beck's Reformed Church?
- 3. Doctrines and Faith Statement of the Candidate.
 - A. Describe your understanding of the nature of God.
 - B. Describe your understanding of the nature of man.
 - C. Describe your views of sin and how the problem of sin is remedied.
 - D. Describe how salvation comes into a person's life.
 - E. How does the salvation event affect a person who has come to saving faith?
 - f. What are your views of Holy Scripture?
 - g. Describe your view of the Church?
 - h. Do you personally confess as you own the faith confessed in the Apostle's Creed and the Nicene Creed?
 - i. Have you read the Heidelberg Catechism? Do you accept its teachings?
 - 4. Will the candidate honor their faith confession and seek to die to themselves and live to the glory and honor of Christ Jesus? Will they seek to serve the Lord in the office to which they are called and be ever seeking the will of Christ in their ministry and witness.

Upon an affirmative vote by the Consistory, the candidate(s) shall be presented to the Congregation at a called or stated meeting (the Congregation having been dutifully notified) and by secret ballot be affirmed or denied. A 2/3 majority vote shall be required for affirmation.

After a positive affirmation, the candidate shall be ordained/licensed at a special service for the candidate.

Proposed Constitution Change

The Consistory unanimously voted to approve and seek congregational approval to change the annual meeting to the month of February and fiscal year of Becks Reformed Church to begin March 1st of each year and end the last day of February. This means that the budget year will start in March and end in February and that new Deacons and Elders and the budget will be voted on at an annual Congregational Meeting in February each year. The new Consistory would start at the beginning of every March. This would not affect Sunday school promotions or other calendar events. The inspiration to make this change is to enhance the Christmas season and provide better financial planning.

The month of December is so busy in the church. There are several special services and events which often bring guests to our church during the Christmas season. The timing of those services and events often coincide with business meetings of the church which at best seem to be awkward at times when there are large numbers of visitors. Secondly, the largest giving month in the church is December. The Deacons will have a better idea of how to plan the church budget with month of December passed. If this motion passes, the current Consistory will serve until the end of February and the 2012 – 2013 Budget of Becks Reformed Church will begin March 1st. Also, if this motion is approved by the Congregation, the first Congregational Meeting will be in February 2013 and not February 2012 since we just had a meeting in December 2011. The proposed changes in the church constitution are in bold, italics & underlined. What will be removed is stroke-through with a single line.

MOTION from the Consistory- To change the fiscal year of Becks Reformed Church to begin in March 1st of each year and end the last day of February and change the annual meeting to the month of February as outlined in the proposed changes in the Constitution of Becks Reformed Church. The first regular scheduled Congregational Meeting will be February 2013.

ARTICLE 7. CONSISTORY

- 2. The Consistory shall organize itself at the first meeting of each calendar *fiscal* year electing a president, vice-president, a secretary, and a treasurer. The Consistory shall form such committees as will serve the purpose of the church; shall have jurisdiction over, control, maintain and preserve its properties, and minister and control its business affairs, formulate congregational policies, manage and administer the program of the church and be responsible to the congregation for promoting and maintaining the devotional, educational, and financial development of the church, through worship, Christian education, evangelism, community service and foreign missions, stewardship benevolence and Christian concern.
- 5. Nominations shall be given from the pulpit or by bulletin or letter at least two weeks before the congregational meeting held for election of Elders and Deacons. The congregational meeting for election of Elders and Deacons shall be held on the first Sunday in December of each year *in the month of February of each year*.

ARTICLE 11. CHURCH MEETINGS

1.	The annual meeting of the church shall be held in the month of December <i>February</i> . At this meeting, the Con-
	sistory, the officers of the committees of the church, the Pastor(s), may submit recommendations.

2.	All organizations, if requested, shall give annual reports to the congregation the last Sunday in January in the

We are looking forward to great things happening as a result of our training efforts. November 10th we have scheduled our first official Small Group meeting, where we have invited several unchurched people to attend. Please continue to pray for us and them as we seek to work with those that God has provided to us.

We have also begun a bible study on Sundays at 2 pm - 3 pm, in the home of David Parks. We are studying the book of 1 John, and welcome anyone who wishes to attend.

Pastor Rick Warren reminds us that there are five purposes for which we exist. In Matt 22:37, we are told by Jesus that "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This gives us the first commandment of the New Testament. Our purpose here is to worship God. The second commandment given is "Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. This tells us that as Christians, we are to have a ministry to others by exemplifying the attributes of Christ. In Matt 28:19-20, He says, "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you:" These words reveal to us three other purposes for our existence: We should have an ongoing mission, where we share the gospel of Christ with as many people as we can, by our example of a Christ led life, as well as intentionally sharing with those who are lost. Fourth, that we have fellowship one with another, through the sacred rite of baptism. Lastly, that we should be discipling those within our influence, by equipping them to share the gospel to others, as we have.

Are we fulfilling the commandments of our Lord by consciously engaging ourselves within the purposes of our existence? Are we ever looking towards our goal of continuing our existence eternally with Him? I trust that each person within our congregation will grab hold of these commands and make them real and active within your own life.

In closing, here is a thoughtful phrase that I believe we at Beck's Church should take on as our goal:

"To be a congregation which cooperates with God in bringing redemption to broken lives."

Let us all pray that this will be our reputation within our local community of needy souls.


