From the Pastor...

Living on the Edge of Existence

As a pastor with forty plus years of experience, I have seen people who chose to have nothing to do with Jesus or His church. I have seen people who often come to worship but to nothing else and I have seen people for whom worship is not enough and they are constantly seeking more and more of the knowledge of God and the fellowship with other people who are hungering for Jesus in their life.

In this message I want to speak to the second group who attend worship and nothing else. There may have been people in your life who have told you that if you worship God at church once a week and that if you say your prayers at home then that is enough. I want to tell you that you are missing out on the joy that can come only by seeking more than this

approach. Jesus said, "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst after

righteousness for they shall be filled." I want to tell some of you my dear and precious loved ones that your soul is suffering from poor spiritual nutrition habits. While poor nutrition will not result in death, it does

not make for healthy living. Eventually, poor nutrition brings on suffering and discomfort. This is true physically and spiritually.

Our souls need feeding and God is providing us with numerous opportunities here at Beck's to grow stronger.

There are numerous study opportunities and service opportunities. The church leadership can direct you to places for growth beyond those offered by the church. An excellent example for

women's spiritual growth is the Beth Moore program called Women of the Word. I have a dear friend who has recently become involved in this program and has experienced joy in life through the study of the Word.

I am worried about the spiritual health of all who have no appetite for God. No hungering after a more full knowledge of Jesus and the Christian faith and life. I know they are not enjoying good spiritual health. Jesus came that you might have a more abundant life. If you want real joy in life he can give it.

The KFC and CYF met on Sunday, September 18, 2011 at

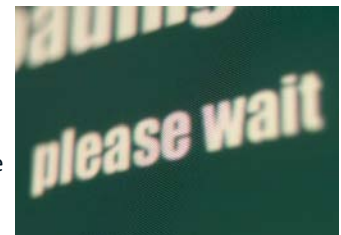
10:30 am until 4:30 pm with 5 brave souls and 19 excited kids. Our Adventure was named Fruit of the Spirit Adventure.

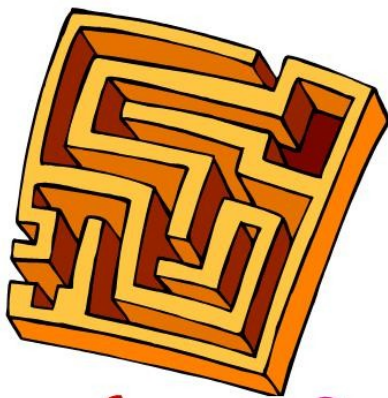

Over the past few weeks, Small Group Ministries has repeatedly witnessed the moving of God within our training sessions. As we continue to bond and come to truly know each other, there are special relationships being established amongst us that did not exist before. We thank God for opening up our hearts and allowing His love to be implemented between our brothers and sisters in Christ.

We have likewise experienced an onslaught of opposition from Satan. Make no mistake about it, when spiritual progress is being made; when hearts are seeking to be drawn closer to God, Satan will oppose and fight. Ephesians 6:12 tells us:
