From the Pastor...God's First Building Block for Human Society

***Genesis 2:18
And the Lord God
said, "It is not good
that man should be
alone; I will make
him a helper
comparable to him***

The month of February is a month when the whole world celebrates romantic love and historically pays tribute to St. Valentine. The celebration has nothing to do with the real St. Valentine who was martyred in Rome for his loyalty to Christ in the face of the Roman hostility to the Gospel. As is the case so often, a historical personage of the Christian faith has been taken over by secular culture and overlaid with additions that have nothing to do with Christianity.

It does present an opportunity for the Christian faith to confess something very important about the Christian worldview. Christians believe that the creation of man and woman are grounded in the intentional act of God. Genesis 2:18 teaches us that creation was not complete until God created Eve for Adam. The absence of Adam's female counterpart was the only time that God saw the need for addition to the created order. He describes Adam's lack of a helpmate (woman) as not good.

Christians reject the view that society can be ordered successfully apart from the revealed witness of God. The Bible has many examples wherein Israel sought to structure its society apart from God's plan and it always resulted in pain, disorder and chaos. It can be argued that even in pagan (secular) societies when the things men and women

know about God from His creation are violated that disorder ensues (see Romans 1). While there are some exceptions of those whom are specifically called to a celibate life such as Paul (1 Corinthians 7:8), the teaching of the goodness and holiness of marriage between a man and a woman is central in Scripture. The home is the building block of society but the foundation of the home is the parents. Husbands and wives ought to love one another not just romantically but with that same patient and enduring love which we have known in Jesus Christ. The love of Christ for us is not dependent upon His feelings or ours but upon a devoted and sacrificial commitment to our ultimate well-being. The love of husbands and wives in Christ Jesus far transcends the sentimental notions of romanticism that today often seeks to pass itself off as a counterfeit of true love. Jesus loves us when we shine but He also loves us when we fail and fall short of His desires for our lives and our relationship with Him, so husband ought to love their wives as Christ loves the Church (this is a ditto for wives) and gave Himself for it (Eph. 5:25).

Our culture is in trouble and even as I write this message, I must also say that the homes of many Christians are in trouble. I find that because we are surrounded by all kinds of false teachings and beliefs about marriage that we Christians are often more secular than sacred in our approaches to our own marriages. We suffer and our children suffer and

the world which so desperately needs the light of Christ to find real love and commitment does not see it in us.

In my church in Hawaii there were many non-Christians who came to Christ. On the Island of Oahu, people live so close that you cannot help but notice what is going on with your neighbors. I was privileged to have a great number of members who had gotten it right when it came to loving one another in Christ and finding that fulfillment which God intends for man and woman. They touched many of their neighbors who noticed the difference in their own homes and those of the Christians. These non-Christians would ask, "How is it that your home is different than mine?" The answer to that question was always the wonderful plan of God for our lives in Jesus Christ!

Our marriages are under attack today from those who would deceive us by telling us that marriage is just a human institution that can be modified to better suit our needs. I hope you know that this is a lie from the pit of hell. Marriage is ordained of God and is ordered by God and if faithfully lived in the love and grace of Christ will result in our completeness and in a sound society.

When I became a man, I put the ways of childhood behind me. ¹² For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known.

¹³ And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.

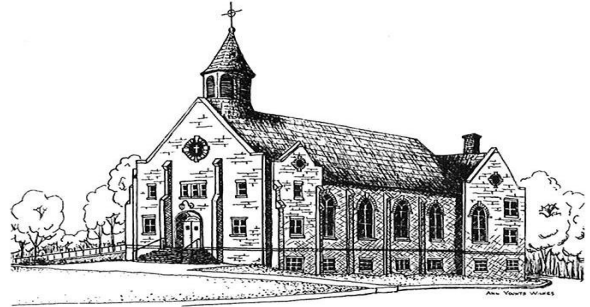
