From the Pastor...

A few years ago, here at Beck's, I preached a sermon on Easter Morning entitled *When the Stone Moved, Everything Changed*. I want to go back to that theme in this message. On that Sunday, I focused upon how the resurrection of our Lord and their encounter with the Risen Lord changed everything in the lives of the disciples and the Jerusalem Church.

This month I would like for you to prayerfully consider how the meeting of the Risen Christ in our lives affects our life. When we read about or talk to a person who has had an encounter with the Risen Lord in their lives we see it is what is called a transforming event. The life of every person who has an encounter

with Jesus is changed. I believe that a real encounter with Jesus changes the way we think and

the way we act. Some of those changes are immediate and some of them are a life long process. If a person has not met Jesus their life is going to remain the same: same old ways of thinking and the same old ways of doing. But for those who meet Jesus, their lives are being transformed because He comes to live in their hearts. Paul writes about the unavoidability of this transformation when he writes in **Romans 8:**

29 For whom He foreknew, He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many

brethren. 30 Moreover whom He predestined, these He also called; whom He called, these He also justified; and whom He justified, these He also glorified

The transformation will happen because the Lord predestines change in our lives if we are in Christ.

Have you really met the Risen Savior? If you have then you will be experiencing a transformation of your life in the direction of reflecting both inwardly and outwardly the way and rule of Jesus in your life. No person really knows Jesus as Lord and Savior without living under His Spirit. If we walk according to the Spirit then we will be changed.

From the Consistory...February Update

Consistory Update: The Consistory met on Monday, February 8 and took the following actions. These actions address current needs as they relate to our educational program, church mission, facility and staff. The congregation charged the Consistory at the Annual Meeting in December to take some action in these areas. Congregational support allows these proactive endeavors to occur. Let us be thankful to God for the blessings He bestows on Beck's Reformed.

- o The Fellowship Hall will receive vinyl siding to cover the wood painted areas of the exterior. Some parts of the exterior will receive new wood where needed.
- o As a raise for any staff was not part of the 2010 budget and there was limited action in this area taken in 2009, staff members will receive a one time bonus. Rev. Sanders and Kevin Lipe will receive \$2,500 and all other staff members (Randy Hedrick, Shirley Putnam, Leslie Ward, Kristie

Regan and our Sextons – Gary and Carole) will receive \$750.

- o Classrooms of the church will be wired to work with the satellite system. This will allow the broadcast of these events as well as any activity in the sanctuary throughout the facility.
- o The Amen corner will receive a new TV. The current Amen corner TV will replace the one in the church office, which monitors security around the main building.
- o All of our Children's Sunday School classrooms and the Genesis classroom will be equipped with a TV and a DVR player.
- o The adult classes are asked to purchase a TV and, if they desire, a DVR player (to match those being purchased) for their classroom. These adult classes are the Koinonia, CIA and Women's. (The Men's and FFC have all ready purchased TV's).
- o Wireless internet service will be made available in the Grand Hall and the Fellowship Hall. This ac-

tion will allow our teachers to enhance and expand their instruction.

- o A gate will be installed to secure the audio and video equipment in the balcony. This gate will be designed to not take away from the appearance of the sanctuary nor impede movement in the stairway.

The Consistory acted with serious thought and with vision toward our current and future needs. We have been blessed with a staff that has been patient during our fiscal concerns of the past few years. Our current fiscal standing allows us as a Church Family to take steps to improve our facility and to meet the needs of a believing congregation. There are other issues that will soon need the attention of our Church Family (parking lot, restroom, BBQ pit, etc.). Your continued support is needed, both spiritually and financially, for Beck's to address its Vision Statement – *To Love and Serve God; To Accept His Son Jesus Christ; To Live and Proclaim the Gospel; To Provide Christian Fellowship; To Share His Love with a Hurting and Lost*

World. The Consistory believes these actions are focused on our Vision Statement and we trust that you share in this commitment to Christ Jesus and to His Church, the one we call Beck's Reformed.

From the Consistory...March Update

Consistory Meeting – 3-8-10

The phone in the Fellowship Hall will be for local calls only (no long distance).

A review of the insurance on our facilities appears to be more than adequate.

The insurance representative advised that anytime a group rents a vehicle that the group take out the vehicle's rental insurance. This will then become the first insurance, the driver becomes second and the church is then the third insurer.

Lenten Folder collections will be devoted to Nazareth Children's Home.

The Church will present \$1,000 to Touching Davidson County with Love. This amount will come from our Mission Outreach.

Vinyl siding for the Fellowship Hall has been selected and installation has been approved to begin.

The video/sound committee is making progress toward the installation of TV's and the necessary infrastructure. Positive negotiations are oc-

curing with various suppliers of equipment.

The membership will soon have the ability to utilize e-giving through the church web-site. E-giving is making donations or contributions on-line. More information will be forthcoming.

A 2009 budget contribution analysis was approved and will be printed in the newsletter.

The Koinonia Class is purchasing chairs for their classroom. The Consistory will purchase seminar tables for this room. This addition will allow the Church to have a "classroom" for Bible studies, meetings and seminars where a writing table would be beneficial.

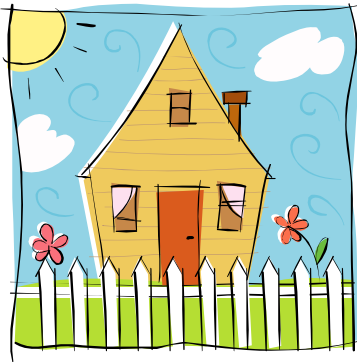

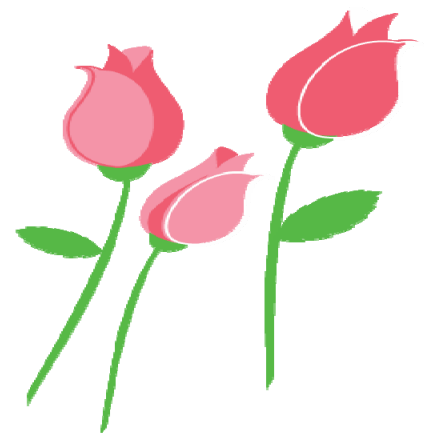

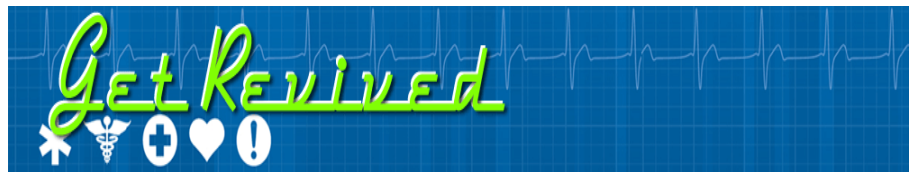


Get-Revived

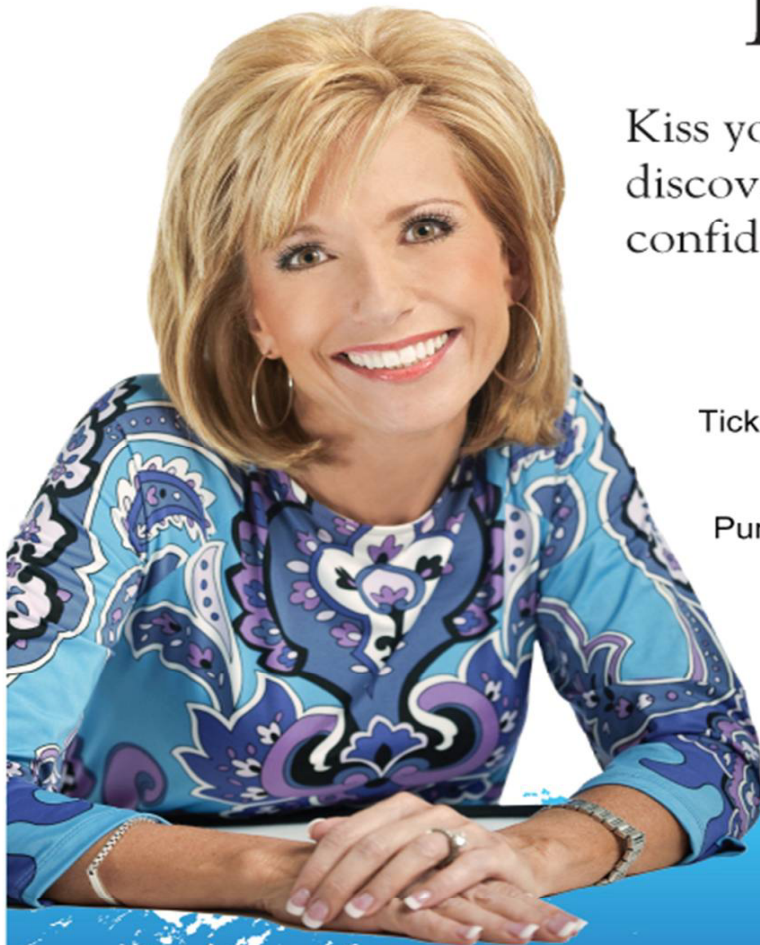

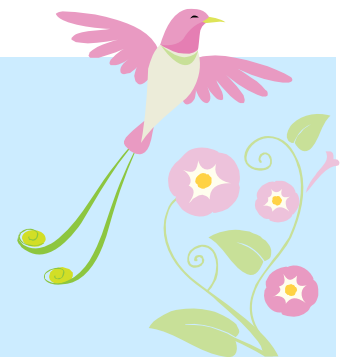

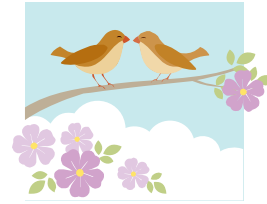
