From the Pastor...Does the Church Really Want Power?

Recently in one of my sermons, I reflected on my time with Christians and their churches on the Indian sub-continent and my contrast that these churches have little money or resources but great power and American churches have great resources and wealth but little power. As studies show, the influence of true evangelical churches is growing less in their influence on people's lives and the life of our culture. Most congregations which are growing are growing by transfers from other churches and not from new converts.

The quality among the Indian Christians which I noted from the clergy to the poorest lay person was the desire to be absolutely faithful to their Savior. I shall never forget meeting a woman who made only twenty-five rupees (about twenty cents) who gave not

only 2.5 rupees to her church (a tithe) but five rupees (20%).

Her pastor told me she would be beaten by her husband when he found out she had been to church and she always asked for prayer. She asked her church to pray that her husband might come to know the wonderful peace in Jesus she had found. Christians are often beaten or mistreated when they share the Gospel and yet they are obedient to the Lord's command to be His witnesses. They refuse to be intimidated! They know the "Great Commission" and it is their mission.

When the mission of Jesus becomes the mission of American churches and they become sacrificial in their obedience to carry it out then they will receive power and again become a life and world changing institution. Our

God is not a God of mediocrity but One who is truly Superlative. He is not satisfied with a people who give Him the left-overs of their time, talents, money and service to His mission but with those who give Him the first and best of their lives. We will have power when God's mission and desires are first in our hearts. When *the Great Commission* becomes our mission then we shall have power!
